Dear Friends,

The verse above from the Book of Proverbs rings so true to our children's needs today. They are indeed God's gift to us. ANGEL FOOD MINISTRIES – CEC Connection

Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization dedicated to providing grocery relief and financial support to communities throughout the United States. The program began in 1994 with 34 families in Monroe, Georgia (between Atlanta and Athens), and has grown to serve hundreds of thousands of families every month across 32 states. Angel Food Ministries crosses denominational lines and has spread to the Central Texas area with a distribution site at Hill Country Nazarene Church (HCNC) on Bagdad Road in Cedar Park. Because we see the enormous ministry potential of AFM, CEC is exploring a partnership with HCNC.

Blessings by the box -- Angel Food's groceries are sold in a quantity that can fit into a medium-sized box at \$25 per unit. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists of both fresh and frozen items with an average retail value of approximately \$50. Comparison shopping has been done across the country in various communities using a wide range of retail grocery stores and has resulted in the same food items costing from between \$42 and \$78.

Generally, one unit of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week or a single senior citizen for almost a month. The food is all the same high quality one would purchase at a grocery store. There are no second-hand items, no damaged or out-dated goods, no dented cans without labels, no day-old breads and no produce that is almost too ripe.

Also offered are specialty boxes such as steaks, chicken and pork. Many participants in this bonus program appreciate the expanded choices. Additionally, there is no limit to the number of units or bonus foods an individual can purchase, and there are no applications to complete or qualifications to which participants must adhere. Angel Food Ministries, like most all other retail grocery stores, also participates in the U.S. Food Stamp program, using the Off-Line Food Stamp Voucher system.

How the Program works -- Food sales and distribution are handled by church host sites such as Hill Country Nazarene Church. Currently CEC is partnering with Hill Country Nazarene Church to deliver this program to CEC and needy families in our area. Orders and CASH payments will be collected at CEC after services on June 3, 10 and 17. These orders are then turned in to the Angel Food main office in Monroe, Georgia. Food Distribution will be held on June 30th from 9 – 10:30am at Hill Country Nazarene Church 1750 Bagdad Rd just 1.5 miles east of FM1431.

Sickly as a child (perhaps with a lifelong struggle with tuberculosis) Robert Louis Stevenson, son of a Scottish lighthouse engineer, wrote many of his greatest works while sick in bed, daydreaming while looking out the window in what he called "the land of counterpane." He gathered enough strength as an adult to fulfill his wish of travelling the seas and died at 44 on a Somoan island. At left is his self-penned epitaph.
